Levy Park held its grand reopening on February 25, 2017. The Park, which is located near the intersection of Richmond at Eastside, is just over a mile from Winlow Place. The Park has been completely renovated, and features curated, year-round programming, native landscaping and botanical experiences, one of a kind children's play, interactive water features, a performance pavilion, an event lawn, a community garden and dog park. Houston's Bike Plan is nearly complete! The City of Houston is updating the Houston Bike Plan for the first time since 1993. The draft Plan lays out safer, more comfortable connections citywide for all cyclists. The City says it will take years to implement, but ultimately it means better bicycling for Winlow Place! NEARTOWN NEWS

The Neartown Association meets monthly, 7:00 - 8:00 pm on the 4th Tuesday (next meeting is Feb 28th) at Cherryhurst Community Center, and all are welcome. In January, the Montrose Management District (MMD, http://montrosedistrict.org/) updated its current projects. These include the recently completed lighting of the bridges over Hwy 59, jointly funded through a federal grant, TxDOT, and the MMD. The district has also begun installing MD identity markers, and has completed the first phase of esplanade enhancements – at Yoakum and Lovett Blvd. – with planning for the Montrose esplanade from W. Dallas to W. Gray next on the list. In response to concerns about the lack of community input on these projects, MMD has committed to holding community meetings before commencing the next phase of the esplanade project.

Neartown President Greg LeGrande is a member of a newly formed City Planning Commission Walkable Places Committee, looking at potential revisions to City Ordinances Chapters 26 and 42 to better support planning for walkability.
